

When the Lord Jesus died on the cross, God was punishing Him for your sins. This means that God is able to welcome you into His family, and ultimately into Heaven, as if you had never sinned. When the Lord Jesus rose from the dead, God demonstrated the power that can change your life here and now!

“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come.”

2 Corinthians ch5vs17

You can know the happiness of having peace with God; the joy of serving God; the presence of God’s Holy Spirit helping you to live for God; and the confidence that when you do die you have a place in Heaven guaranteed by God (read Romans ch6vs22-23).

But God will not force you to have the best of both worlds. If you ignore Him, God has no option but to separate you from His presence for all eternity, His holiness demands it!

Instead, why not confess to God that you are a sinner. Tell Him that you are truly sorry and that you accept that the death of the Lord Jesus was for your sins. It is a decision that you will never regret.

The Best of Both Worlds



“A man’s life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions.”

Luke ch12vs15

“Let’s eat, drink and be merry, for tomorrow we die.”

Perhaps this saying is a familiar one to you; maybe you use it yourself to describe your attitude to life. But did you know that it comes from the Bible?

In the book of Ecclesiastes ch8vs15 you will find this “... for there is nothing good for a man under the sun except to eat and to drink and to be merry.”

The Bible might be the last place you would expect to find a saying like this! But the book of Ecclesiastes is all about a man called Solomon trying to find a purpose for his life without God.

In the last chapter of this book, having tried every kind of pleasure in the world, Solomon wrote...

“Meaningless! Meaningless!
Says the Teacher. Everything is
meaningless!”

Ecclesiastes ch12vs8

**So how can we find
meaning in life?**

Whatever we like to think, we cannot live a satisfying life without God. Men and women are being told the lie that happiness can be found by having more of everything:

- more money
- more alcohol
- more drugs
- more sex

Even common sense tells us that this simply is not true: are royalty, or rock stars or big businessmen leading happy, satisfied lives?

God reminded a group of Christians in the Bible of what they had in life before they had Him...

“You were at that time separate
from Christ, ... having no hope
and without God in the World!”

Ephesians ch2vs12

No hope! – Maybe you have never considered your life in those terms. You considered the hopeless cases to be those whose lives are ruled by drink or drugs.

On the other hand, perhaps you recognise this description of yourself only too well.

Whatever we think of our lives, God sees us all alike: if we don’t have Him we have ‘no hope’ either in this life or in the after life.

Remember that there is an after life. However rich or poor we are doesn’t matter. What really matters is whether we have prepared in this life to meet God after we die.

The Bible says...

“For what does it profit a man to
gain the whole world, and forfeit
his soul?”

Mark ch8vs36

For many people, however, Christianity is something they associate only with death. They think of Christian living as a negative, kill-joy way of life.

Other people know that Christianity is right but feel that their life is too far gone to be changed by ‘religion’, as they call it.

**The great news that God brings to us
in the Bible is that Christ’s death and
resurrection can change your life right
now as well as for ever!**
